A PROCLAMATION

VIETNAM VETERAN'S DAY MARCH 29TH

WHEREAS, the Vietnam War began on September 26, 1959, as the Cold War military conflict called the "Second Indochina War," and through more than a decade of conflict that tested the fabric of our Nation, the service of our men and women in uniform stood true; and

WHEREAS, the Vietnam War is a story of service members of different backgrounds, colors, and creeds who came together to complete a daunting mission; a story of Americans who left the warmth of family to serve the country they loved; a story of patriots who braved the line of fire, cast themselves into harm's way to save a friend, and fought hour after hour, day after day to preserve the liberties we hold dear; and

WHEREAS, On March 29, 1973, the last of our troops left Vietnam, and half a century after those helicopters swept off the ground and into the annals of history, we pay tribute to the fallen, the missing, the wounded, the millions who served, and the millions more who awaited their return; and

WHEREAS, there were over 165,000 service members from Wisconsin who valiantly served their country during the Vietnam War, and 1,239 Wisconsin service members who made the ultimate sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the Wisconsin Veterans listed on the Vietnam Memorial Wall in Washington, D.C., and to express our pride, respect, and deepest gratitude to all who served, the State of Wisconsin, by 2009 Wisconsin Act 3, has designated March 29 of each year as “Vietnam Veterans Day.”

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Pete Russo, Chair of the Ashland County Board, along with all members of the Ashland County Board, do hereby proclaim the 29th day of March, 2013, as ***VIETNAM VETERANS DAY*** and ask all citizens pay tribute to those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the name of freedom.

**RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH AN AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISE AREA

WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection is accepting petitions for the designation of Agricultural Enterprise Areas (AEA) throughout the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, agriculture is an important component of the Ashland County economy, landscape and rural character; and

WHEREAS, Ashland County has consistently supported the agricultural industry; and

WHEREAS, the Ashland County Comprehensive Plan adopted November 29, 2006 identifies a goal of preserving the County’s agricultural land base to protect the county’s aesthetics, rural character, and agricultural heritage for future generations; and

WHEREAS, the County believes that establishment of an Agricultural Enterprise Area will further protect agricultural land and enhance the local agricultural economy; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined, based on petitioner support and meetings where Agricultural Enterprise Areas were discussed, that there is public support for the AEA; and

WHEREAS, agriculture is an important land use in the County and worthy of preservation and support;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby supports the establishment of the Fields, Woods and Waters AEA within Ashland County.

RESOLUTION - R03-2013-1116

RESOLUTION TO RESTORE BASE-LEVEL FUNDING TO COUNTY LAND CONSERVATION DEPARTMENTS AS SUPPORTED BY WISCONSIN COUNTIES ASSOCIATION, WISCONSIN FARM BUREAU, AND WISCONSIN FARMER'S UNION

WHEREAS, the State Legislature and Governor enacted into law in 1997, a new county-based system to protect our land and water resources from impacts associated with Non Point Source Pollution that lead to soil loss and polluted runoff; and,

WHEREAS, the County Land Conservation Department is the necessary local delivery mechanism for a wide range of natural resource management programs; and

WHEREAS, Section 92.16(6)(b) of the Wisconsin Statutes states that the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection shall attempt to provide funding for an average of 3 staff persons per county, with an average of \$100,000 per county for cost-sharing grants; and,

WHEREAS, the Department's Soil and Water Resource Management program has not met the funding expectations related to this statutory staffing goal; and,

WHEREAS, County Land Conservation staff supported by state grants have consistently decreased since the program began, from 219 in 1997 to 97 in 2012, under the 2011-2013 biennial budget and approved agency lapses; and,

WHEREAS, counties have been asked to pick up the funding shortfalls to maintain necessary program implementation or reduce needed service to clients; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection has requested that additional reductions in base staff funding allocations be included in the 2013-15 biennial budget reducing the funding from a 12 year average of \$9.3 million down to \$7.8 million in 2014 & \$8.0 million in 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Counties Association (WCA), the Wisconsin Farm Bureau Federation (WFB), and the Wisconsin Farmer's Union (WFU) have all adopted 2013 statewide policy directives that recognize the valuable work that County Land Conservation Departments provide to their membership by supporting directives that support maintaining this base level of funding; and

WHEREAS, County Land Conservation staff play a critical role to our local economy by assisting landowners to obtain needed state and federal funds to help implement Non Point Source Pollution control Best Management Practices for their operations and the proposed cuts will therefore have a rippling negative impact on our county's citizens and its resources.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ashland County Board of Supervisors does hereby urge the Governor of the State of Wisconsin and all elected representatives in the Wisconsin State Legislature to return to the \$9.3 million appropriation for state aid to counties, recognizing the invaluable service that county conservation employees provide in helping Wisconsin farmers and growing our state's agriculture industry.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ASHLAND COUNTY TO JOIN THE NORTHWOOD'S RAIL TRANSIT COMMISSION

WHEREAS, representatives of Barron, Florence, Forest, Lincoln, Marinette, Oneida, Price, Rusk and Vilas counties have been meeting since June of 2011 for the purposes of addressing a mutual concern over the quality and quantity of freight rail service to their businesses and communities; and

WHEREAS, as a coalition, this county group has adopted a mission statement as follows:
To sustain and enhance safe, reliable and efficient rail service critical to the
businesses, communities and economies in northern Wisconsin and the Upper
Peninsula of Michigan; and

WHEREAS, through their deliberations, this county group has determined that creation of a
formal multi-county rail transit commission is the most effective means to advance
this mission; and

WHEREAS, rail transit commissions can apply for grants and other assistance from the
Wisconsin Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, rail transit commissions can be formed by intergovernmental agreement under
WI. Stats. 66.0301; and

WHEREAS, the county group has drafted an intergovernmental agreement that creates a rail
transit commission that maintains fiscal authority with the county boards.

WHEREAS, Ashland County has been invited to become a member of the Northwood's Rail
Transit Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Ashland County Finance Committee at their November 27, 2012 meeting
approved using \$500.00 from the 2012 Contingency Fund to join the Northwood's
Rail Transit Commission and to move it forward to the full Board for action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Ashland County hereby enters into a joint
intergovernmental agreement under Wisconsin Statutes 66.0301 to join the
Northwood's Rail Transit Commission and the County Board Chair and County Clerk
be given the authority to sign the proper forms.

**RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND
BUDGET DISBURSEMENT POLICY**

WHEREAS, the Ashland County Board upon approving the 2013 Ashland County Budget,
created a line item in the budget called Economic Development Fund, and

WHEREAS, this has created the need to have an "Economic Development Fund Budget
Disbursement Policy," and

WHEREAS, the Ashland County Board of Supervisors Handbook adopted April 17, 2012 defines the duties of the Ashland County Finance and Economic Development Committee, and

WHEREAS, the Ashland County Board of Supervisors' Handbook further states the Finance and Economic Development Committee shall have the following economic development responsibilities:

1. This Committee shall foster the spirit of furthering the socio-economic development of Ashland County, and assist the political subdivisions of Ashland County, when requested, in their resource development efforts and seek out and work with local development groups, the federal, state and local agencies, in the development and utilization of Ashland County resources.
2. Shall work as the liaison for Ashland County in order to encourage, assist, or improve the economy in or near Ashland County.
3. Shall work with the Development organizations and Committees in the coordinated effort to promote this region and solve its mutual problems.
4. Shall work with all agencies on matters pertinent to the development utilization of Ashland County resources.

WHEREAS, the Finance and Economic Committee approved at their February 25, 2013 an Economic Development Fund Budget Disbursement Policy and to forward this policy on to the full Ashland County Board of Supervisors for action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ashland County Board of Supervisors assembled this 21st day of March, 2013, and approved the Economic Development Fund Budget Disbursement Policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Ashland County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Ashland County Finance and Economic Development Committee to administer the Ashland County budgeted line item "Economic Development Fund." Said funds shall be distributed based upon the Economic Development Fund Budget disbursement.
