Jail Population Review:

53 inmates; there are quite a few bail jumping cases in jail.

TAD report:

TAD has nine people in the TAD program. The majority of participants are bail jumping cases.

Adult Drug court report:

465 jail beds saved in the last 6 months

641 hours of adult community service performed; 146 hours of juvenile community service completed; 767 hours of offender employment provided; 33.5 hours of work experience provided.

New Business:

CHIP (County Health Improvement Plan) discussed the work that has occurred in the past year. The committee selected three goals to work towards:

1. Create options for sober activities and recreation; the newspaper now publishes activities with a sober icon badge next to the activity letting the public know that this is an alcohol free event.
2. Increase alcohol education programs in Ashland and Bayfield counties and schools
3. Develop and electronic resource guide

There has been a marketing campaign that uses the slogan “One less Day” of binge drinking. The web address is: www.onelessday.org.

There are One Less Day business cards that will be handed out or placed where they can be picked up with court material.

Round Robin:

Greg Bebeau discussed a recent training about Food Share fraud. The misuse of Quest cards and the money it is costing the state.

Bad River Update: Bad River AODA is putting together a day treatment program. They will be able to do third party billing and the program will be available for non-members. The start day will be October 1st, 2014. They have submitted for state certification.

They have also seeking to create a Men’s sober house capable of holding 16.
