Minutes:

March minutes were approved with no changes noted.

New Members:

Old Business:

Sub-committee reports:

Jail Population Review: Today's population was 54. The capacity of the jail is 68 beds. There are 9 people on EMP.

TAD report:

Scott not present and no report presented

Adult Drug court report: There are 13 participants in drug court. There was a graduation last Tuesday. Six assessments are in the works.

Longrun report:

We have one person doing community service. Trying to find out if it is possible for us to sell equipment on line.

Children of Incarcerated Parents:

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Discussion of supervised visitations. The question was asked , how do they get in to a supervised visit program? Do we have any idea how many would participate in a year. Response was that we would probably have to go through every file. Ways into a supervised visitation program: civil restraining orders, tribal court, family law, court ordered. What data exists about numbers of past supervised visits? The Judge stated he would track the numbers.

New Business:

The Judge provided information about new legislation that was passed. The synthetic marijuana bill was signed. This bill covers all changes to compounds and therefore all synthetic marijuana drugs are now illegal; this also covers kratom.

Other changes:

- ❖ Change in the length of an injunction; an extension can be granted if there is substantial risk
- ❖ Stalking injunction
- ❖ County can seek reimbursement from jail prisoners through the tax intercept program.

Heroin training will be at the conference center in the Bad River casino. The training date is May 13th, starting at 9AM.

Round Robin:

- ❖ BIRT and the Adult drug court program are showing a three part series of movies on drugs and addictions. The dates are April 29th (The Anonymous People); Tuesday , May 6th (Pleasures Unwoven); and Wednesday, May 14th, a film on narcotic addiction (Out of Reach). All of the films are being shown at the Ashland High School auditorium, 6:30 PM.
- ❖ First responders can be trained in the use of NARCAN
- ❖ Discussion about the CJC position and if the state will fund these positions. Suggestion was to write a letter to the legislative representative to seek funding for this position
- ❖ Vine App is called vinemobil. VINE can be used to get victim notification when someone is being released from jail or prison. The VINE protection system allows victims who have restraining orders to log in and enter a request to get notifications when an offender is being released. It also allows them to see when papers have been served.
- ❖ New Horizons North, Andrew gave a brief update on a developing partnership. Comprehensive community program with a goal of reducing the waiting list for services.. He will be on the agenda next month.
