Jail Population Review:

The jail population has been fluctuating daily. The average is approximately 51 for the month but over the weekend it jumped to 62. There are 3 people on EMP.

TAD report:

Statewide oversight committee is visiting the Bayfield and Ashland TAD sites. They will be in Ashland on September 9th.

Adult Drug court report:

The program grant extension was accepted and the program is funded through September 30th, 2015. There are 13 participants in the program and the majority of them are employed or going to school.

Longrun report:

Longrun participated in Clean sweep. We collected 130 TV's.

Children of Incarcerated Parents:

The committee did not meet in July.

Ordinance regarding raising the fine on shoplifting, possession of tobacco, or disorderly conduct from \$25 to \$50 can be done at the local level. The maximum it can be raised to is \$50. Check local ordinances to see current language.

New Business:

Barb Flynn gave a presentation about the Health Care Clinic in Ashland and Washburn. The Ashland Clinic's address is 313 Third Street West; Washburn's address is 409 W. Bayfield Street.

A few of the services it provides for women includes emergency contraception, routine gynecological exams, and STD exams and treatment. For men it provides STD exams and treatment. They also provide free condoms.

Judge Eaton provided information about the Firearm Surrender Hearing Civil Injunction case that goes into effect on 11/01/2014. There will be more documentation regarding firearm DV injunctions. The firearm possession form needs to be filled out by the client; they have 48 hours to surrender their firearms. If the firearms aren't surrendered there is a possible penalty of imprisonment up to 9 months and a fine up to \$10,000.

If the respondent doesn't show for the hearing the petitioner can describe the firearms and the court then sets up a firearm surrender hearing. The defendant needs to petition the court to get the firearm back. If convicted of domestic violence they can no longer possess a firearm.

Round Robin:

Karen Baker: the school district is waiting to hear if they received a DPI grant that focuses on mental health in school. The grant would provide dollars to have mental health treatment providers come into the school to provide services to the students in need.

The school is also putting together a committee to look and the Hazelton recommendations.

Kelly McKnight: the district attorney's office has filed more felony charges this year than any previous years. We have more felonies charged then all of last year. 2013 had 148 charged felonies; August 2014 has 158 felonies with four months to go in the year.

Misdemeanor cases are down about the same amount that felonies are up. We have had 3 heroin cases filed and many meth cases.
