

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING A PORTION OF ASHLAND COUNTY'S
ORDINANCE #0-5-1993-14 REGULATING DOGS AND OTHER ANIMALS
WITHIN THE COUNTY OF ASHLAND**

The Board of Supervisors of Ashland County, Wisconsin ordains as follows:

A. "An ordinance Regulating Dogs and Other Animals Within the County of Ashland" adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Ashland County on May 18, 1993 is amended to repeal Section 1.13 of such ordinance and to repeal the Schedule of Forfeitures attached thereto, and the following Section 1.13 and the annexed Schedule of Forfeitures is hereby adopted in place of those repealed:

Section 1.13. Penalty.

Any person violating Sections 1.01 or 1.02 of this ordinance shall be required to forfeit not more than \$100.00 plus costs for the first offense and not more than \$200.00 plus costs for the second or subsequent offense within three (3) years of the first offense.

Any person violating Sections 1.03, 1.04, 1.05 or 1.06 of this ordinance shall be required to forfeit not more than \$150.00 plus costs for the first offense and not more than \$300.00 plus costs for the second or subsequent offense within three (3) years of the date of the first offense.

Any person violating Section 1.07 of this ordinance shall be required to forfeit not more than \$100.00 plus costs for the first offense and not more than \$300.00 plus costs for the second or subsequent offense within three (3) years of the date of the first offense.

The term "costs" as used in this ordinance shall mean and refer to all the fees, assessments, court costs and other amounts state law requires to be paid on a forfeiture on the date of the violation.

An officer issuing a citation alleging a violation of any section of this ordinance may print on the face of the citation for a deposit the amount which is set forth on the annexed Schedule of Forfeitures, which Schedule of Forfeitures is incorporated herein by reference as a part of this ordinance.

The deposit stated on the citation is the amount which a violator can deposit with the court and forfeit in lieu of appearing in court.

If the issuing officer is of the opinion the violation is of sufficient seriousness to warrant a penalty exceeding the amount of the forfeiture which is set forth in the annexed Schedule of

Forfeitures, the officer may enter on the face of the citation the words "must appear" in lieu of stating a deposit.

B. Except as amended hereby, the ordinance regulating dogs and other animals within the County of Ashland which was adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Ashland County, Wisconsin on May 18, 1993 remains in full force and effect and is hereby ratified.
