

**AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ASHLAND COUNTY'S
JUNKYARD ORDINANCE**

WHEREAS, Ashland County's Junkyard Ordinance, which was established by an amendment on November 10, 1964, provides that any premises in which more than one automotive vehicle not in running condition or operating condition is stored in the open, constitutes a junkyard, and

WHEREAS, under this broad definition there are a very large number of junkyards in Ashland County, and

WHEREAS, Ashland County has no effective way to enforce such ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the Zoning and Land Committee of the Ashland County Board of Supervisors has considered the matter of this ordinance and recommends that it be repealed, leaving it up to the various towns to define and regulate junkyards within their respective jurisdictions,

NOW, THEREFORE,

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Ashland does ordain as follows:

1. That Ashland County's present Junkyard Ordinance, which was established by an amendment on November 10, 1964, be and the same hereby is repealed in its entirety.
2. That as per §59.14(1) Wisconsin Statutes, the County Clerk shall immediately publish this ordinance as a Class I Notice under Chapter 985 Wisconsin Statutes and provide and distribute copies of it to the several town clerks who shall file it in their respective offices.
