

ORDINANCE NO. 012-2000-34

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A HIGHER
"HUBER LAW" FEE IN ASHLAND COUNTY

WHEREAS, pursuant to §303.08(1), Wisconsin Statutes, any person sentenced to a county jail for a crime, nonpayment of a fine or forfeiture or contempt of court, may be granted the privilege of leaving the jail during the necessary and reasonable hours for any of the purposes permitted therein, and

WHEREAS, §303.08(4), Wisconsin Statutes, provides in part that every prisoner who is gainfully employed or who receives unemployment insurance or employment training benefits while in custody in the jail, shall be liable for charges not to exceed the full per person maintenance and cost of the prisoner's board in the jail as fixed by the County Board after the passage of an appropriate county ordinance, and

WHEREAS, Ashland County currently charges prisoners exercising Huber Law privileges a fee of \$10.00 per day (plus tax) which is less than the full per person maintenance and cost of the prisoner's board in the County Jail and is less than what other counties in the area are charging,

NOW, THEREFORE,

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Ashland does ordain as follows:

Effective upon publication, prisoners in the Ashland County Jail (the Ashland County Law Enforcement Center) exercising Huber Law privileges under §303.08, Wisconsin Statutes, shall pay a fee of \$14.00 per day (plus tax) to Ashland County, which amount is less than the full per person maintenance and cost of the prisoner's board.

This ordinance is adopted as per §303.08(4), Wisconsin Statutes. This ordinance supersedes and replaces any inconsistent provision in any prior County ordinance on this subject.


